Allegheny Valley Habitat for Humanity, in partnership with Zion Community Network, was awarded \$3 million dollars by the Commonwealth's Redevelopment Assistance Capital Program (RACP) to develop a comprehensive community initiative (CCI) as part of its Alcoa Legacy Project. Through the direct support of District 33 Rep Carrie Lewis DelRosso, the award funding will enable a CCI to be hosted at the former Alcoa R&D site in New Kensington, PA. This 17+ acre site will host the CCI that will feature veteran housing along with wrap-around support services from partnering organizations that include workforce development, food bank distribution, broadband access, and counseling services made available to serve vulnerable populations throughout the Allegheny Valley

The Alcoa Legacy Project works to align with Westmoreland County's "Reimagining Our Westmoreland County" comprehensive plan as it utilizes the power of partnership to grow our shared communities. Currently, efforts are focused on finalizing a comprehensive plan and ensuring compliance efforts are in place for fund disbursement. More details to come.

Chris's Construction

Corner Construction Manager Chris Andrig provides some insightful homeownership tips for this spring maintenance.

- Examine roof shingles to see if any were lost or damaged during winter.
- Check connections of all gutters and downspouts.
- Low areas in the yard or next to the foundation should be filled with compacted soil.
- Inspect and seal concrete cracks.
- Remove firewood stored near the home. Firewood should be stored at least 18 inches off the ground at least 2 feet from the structure.



Check outside hose faucets for freeze damage and conduct annual AC unit maintenance and repair.
